Canton School District 41-1 Board of Education Proceedings

The Canton School District Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, June 13, 2016 at 7:00 pm, in the school library.

Members and others present: Christal Dietzenbach, Jon Gustad, Bruce Henke, Tanya Iverson, Todd Larson and Tracey Zylstra, Principals Townsend and Devitt, Supt. Gerber, and Business Manager Thompson.

The meeting was called to order, and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

J. Gustad moved, second by C. Dietzenbach to approve the agenda as amended, and the following consent agenda items: approve the minutes from the regular meeting held May 9 and the special meeting held May 24, 2016; accept the resignations from Katie Olson-teacher(with penalty), Mariah Cavin, and Molly Windschill-aides, and Bob Miller and Mike Ingebrigtson-custodians; offer and accept the contract with Jeremiah Peterson as 3rd grade teacher; approve open enrollment requests for five students; accept contracts from: Jodi Baldwin-school nurse, returning custodians and para-professionals; accept contracts from secretaries to be amended upon completion of the negotiations process; close the existing bond redemption fund as this bond was paid off in December, and move remaining revenues to the Capital Outlay fund; and, set the proposed budget hearing for 2016-17 for Monday, July 11, 2016 at 8:00 pm in the school library. Aye: all members

T. Iverson moved, second by T. Larson to approve the bills for payment. Aye: all members

D. Dietzenbach moved, second by J. Gustad to accept the financial statement for the month of May 2016. Aye: all members

Administrative reports were given and included: Accelerated Reader will be replaced with Reading Plus, Ready To Start students will begin July 6th, and there are several aide positions to be filled.

Supt. Gerber reported on plans at the Cedar Street property, and discussed the possibility of a school resource officer position with the board.

<u>6/29/16</u> T. Larson moved, second by C. Dietzenbach to amend the 2015-16 Budget as follows: Pension funds will not be used for South Dakota Retirement for the 2015-16 school year; Use the Capital Outlay flexibility in the amount of \$200,000 instead of \$400,000. for 2015-16; and increase general fund revenues and expense to account for the EpScore Grant used for Project Lead the Way Camp, and Robotics Camp, in the amount of \$14, 045.55. Aye: all members

Appointed to serve on the Performing Arts Center Building Design Committee are: Tanya Iverson, Christal Dietzenbach and Jon Gustad.

At this time the board canvassed the results of the Performing Arts Center Bond Election.

<u>6/30/16</u> T. Zylstra moved, second by T. Larson to certify the Bond election results as passing with 63% of those voting in favor of the Bond issuance. 1,102 votes were cast with 697 in favor of the Bond, and 405 voting nay. Aye: all members

<u>Resolution 6/31/16:</u> C. Dietzenbach moved, second by J. Gustad for the following: Resolution authorizing the execution, terms, issuance and payment of General Obligation Bonds, Series 2016A, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed seven million two hundred thousand dollars and no/100 of the Canton School District 41-1 of Lincoln and Minnehaha Counties, SD and authorization and approval of the Health and Education Facilities authority in state aid pledge agreement. Copies of the full resolution are available in the business office. Aye: all members

<u>6/32/16</u> T. Iverson moved, second by T. Larson to accept the contract with Architecture Inc. of Sioux Falls, SD for the Performing Arts Center, with clarifications to be addressed. Aye: all members

T. Zylstra moved, second by J. Gustad, moving the board to executive session at 8:30 per SDCL 1-25-2 (4) to discuss negotiations. Regular session resumed at 9:15 pm.

The meeting was adjourned. The next regular meeting of the Board, which is the annual meeting and proposed budget hearing, will be Monday, July 11th at 7:00.
